

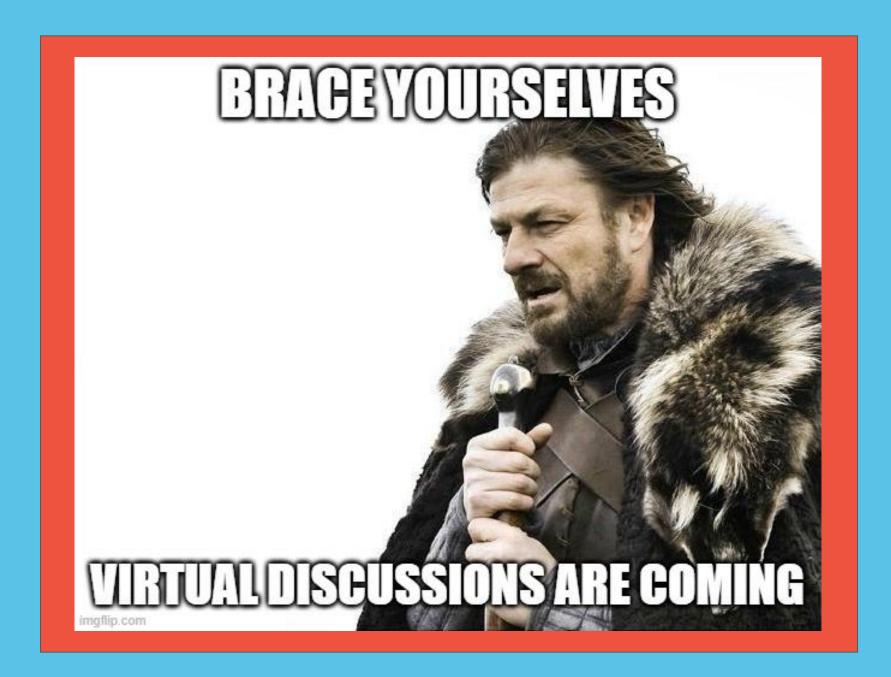

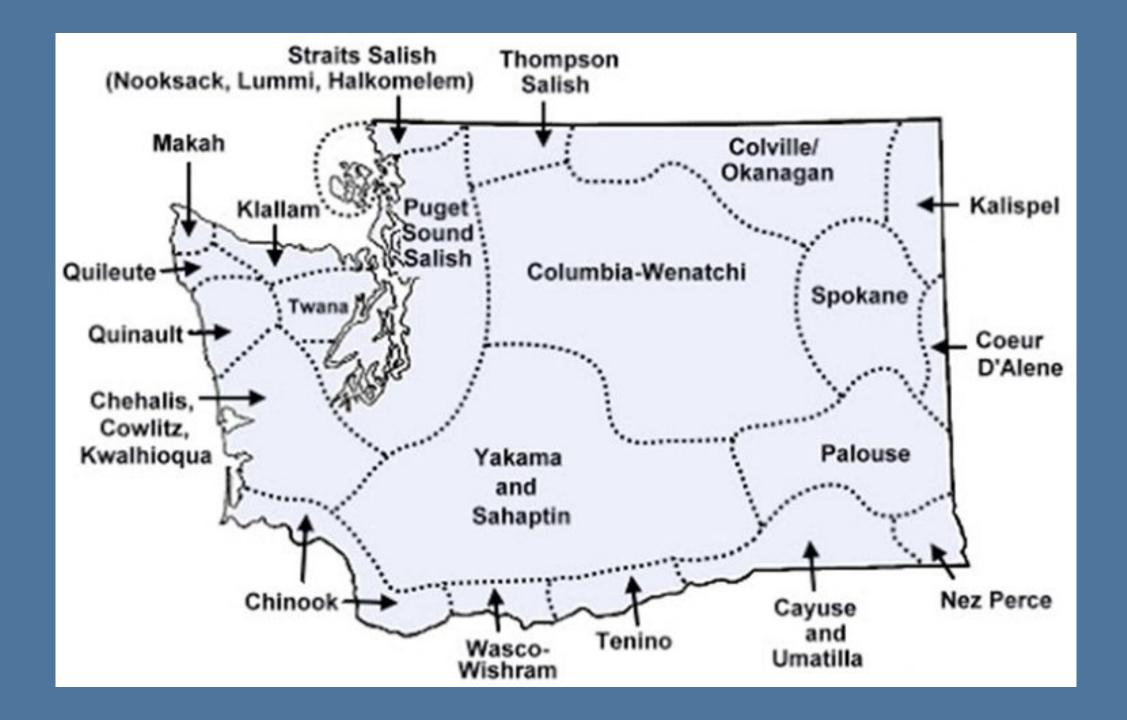


Things to note...





Community Reducing Goals

- Pierce County will reduce actively homeless # by 20% & will reduce # of Young People of Color actively experiencing homelessness by 30% by March 2021
- Spokane will increase their housing placement rate for QTBIPOC by March 2021*
- Yakima will reduce unsheltered homelessness by 10% by Oct 12, 2020***
- Walla Walla will increase their housing placement rate by 40% by March 2021

What is Diversion?

Creative conversations about housing solution and flexible funding when needed.







Exploratory, strengths-based conversation to brainstorm practical solutions for people to resolve their experience of homelessness quickly and safely outside of the homelessness system.



Focused on helping people get past the **immediate barriers** they face in obtaining safe housing.



Generates creative ideas to identify realistic options for safe housing.



Housing options are identified based on the **person's own available resources** rather than those of the homeless response system.



The goal is to become housed right away (within about **30 days**).



One-time financial assistance when needed.



Person-centered and strengths-based approach that assists an individual or household to quickly secure a **permanent** or **temporary** housing solution outside of the homeless response system.



Centralized Diversion Model



- No wrong door.
- Can support young people before they enter the 'system'.
- Community program, rather than program in the community.

Who is Eligible?

- Age 12-24
- Unaccompanied or at imminent risk of becoming unaccompanied
- Experiencing a housing crisis:
 - Literally homeless
 - Staying in shelter
 - Unstable situations: Doubled up/couch surfing
 - Unsafe situations: Fleeing DV or trafficking situation
 - Imminent risk of becoming homeless (under AWHWA's definition)
- Has a plan for being housed outside of the homelessness system within ~30 days

Not Eligible: young people staying in homeless housing programs.

CDF Funds can be used to...



Eliminate a barrier to housing.



Create a new opportunity for housing.




Make existing housing safer or more tenable.



Resolve a conflict that was threatening housing.



Result is a client being housed permanently or temporarily outside of the homelessness system.



Building Yes-to-Yes communities

- AWHWA wants to prevent and end unaccompanied youth and young adult homelessness across WA.
- We value:
 - Ending, not just responding.
 - Justice to end homelessness, we need to end disproportionality too.
 - Data we need to know our impacts, pivot and learn.





Diversion is the idea that providing people experiencing housing instability with support to find housing outside of the system will mean fewer people experiencing homelessness.



- People need and want different things, and have different perceptions of what housing will work for them.
- Rejects the idea that people experiencing homelessness are in that position due to fundamental flaws.
- We as service providers actually don't have all the answers. Working with young folks should come from a place of partnership & trust.
- We need to actively center justice.

History of boarding schools; conflation of poverty and neglect

Planned food insecurity

Racialized mass incarceration = parents being locked up, young people with records unable to get housed

Mass incarceration and deportation of undocumented people

Child welfare **Assimilation** & Genocidal **Schools Systems** Youth Housing Homelessness **System** Incarceration **Systems** Mental Health & ICE / **Behavioral Imigration** System

Historically institutionalized slavery, genocide, and monopolized resources

Profiling = losing jobs and opportunities due to identity

Redlining

Gentrification

Gutting of public housing

Warehousing of young people in mental health and behavioral health systems - cycle of exits into homelessness/incarceration

Concentration camps

Systemic oppression means that even if there was no "racist" or "homophobic" people in a system, the system would still be racist and homophobic.



Diversion as a justice-centered practice



- We are not gatekeepers, we are thought-partners
 - Young people should have the power.
 - Bringing people in, not screening them out.
- \$\$ is not the only source of value.
- Removing suspicion and centering trust.
- Doesn't require young people to interact with a system.
- Everyone deserves housing.

- Offer Diversion to <u>everyone</u>.
- We don't know what young people can achieve.
- Get out of young people's way.
- Center trust.
- Believe young people know what they need.
- Focus on strengths to come up with solutions.
