System Improvement

ACTION CYCLE

Functional Zero by the end of 2022.

Goal/Aim:

Increase our housing placement rate by 30% by end of September 2020.

Areas of improvement

Better Utilize
Diversion resources.

Remove barriers to accessing housing programs.

Decrease the number of failed CE referrals.

Change ideas

Make a change to the Diversion conversation guide and test with 5 clients. Street Outreach team to talk to 10 unsheltered YYA about diversion resources in the next week. Add a field to the housing referral paperwork for preferred name and pronouns.

Invite one RRH provider to give clients a 30-day window to provide their vital documents.

Have 1 housing provider reach out to YYA to set housing appointment.


Provide all CE access points with updated eligibility information.





Reflect on and improve YYA engagement and equity lens.







What is an Improvement Project?



Improvement Projects are changes to the system.



Small tests of change that we think could have an impact on our system.



Based in data AND our knowledge of the system.



Explicit prediction of how the change will impact the outcome.

Improvement Project Key Points



Cannot be too small.



One Improvement Project will always lead to another.



Helps us learn from our work.



Can produce rapid results.



Testing v implementation.

What have you noticed your groups doing when we try to talk about improvement projects?



Common Pitfalls

Defensiveness

Project is too big or would take too long.

Talking about lots of ideas, never getting to steps.

Feeling like we have to have a full plan to start executing one change.

Defeated before we start.



Components of a solid test of change



A solid test of change includes...

- Idea for a change
- Baseline data where are we at?
- Predicted impact where do we think we will be?
- Start and End date
- Clear action steps and roles

Things your group should reflect on are...

- How does this project fit into the problem you are trying to solve?
- How are we addressing disproportionality?
- Have we asked young people about this idea?
- Do we have the right people at the table to execute this idea?



System-Level ACI Data Dashboards

- 1. Which area of our system should we focus on?
- 2. Are our improvements impacting our overall progress towards our goal?

Our median monthly housing placement rate is 22 YYA.

Make a specific change to our case conferencing prioritization criteria for one meeting, and see if it results in more housing placements for YYA of color



What is the right data to show teams?

- Think about a time you have seen data shared in a Core Team Meeting.
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Eliciting Discussion from Groups

- Clearly frame the question we are trying to answer/the thing we are trying to accomplish with the meeting.
- Show the right data.
- Ask tangible questions.
 - (Pro-Tip: try to answer your own questions as you are planning the agenda)
- Listen for the core problem or idea people are describing.
- · Summarize, following with a question.

Scaling Down to a Test Size

What is the **smallest** thing we can do to test if this change will have the impact we expect?

Facilitative questions:

- What can we change by next Tuesday?
- Can we try this change in one program?
- Can we try this with one person?
- Can we try this with 10 YYA?
- Can we try this for I week
- What can we try that doesn't require any outside approval?

- 3. Have you asked youth and young adult experts about his idea?
- 4. What do you expect to see change because of this improvement? What is your goal?
- 5. What baseline data are you using to measure success?
- 6. When is your improvement project test going to start and end?
- 7. Who is the lead for this improvement project?
- 8. What are the action steps required to implement this project?
- 9. Do we have the right people at the table to execute this project? If not, how do we get these people to the table?
- 10. Are we having fun?
